### Main Points

- King David, King of Israel is transliterated as David Melech, Melech Yisrael
- In rising from the dead, Jesus conquered death itself.
- There's nothing too big for God.
- No matter what you're going through right now, look to King Jesus.
- The Lord carries out a lot of His purposes and plans through angels.

- Much of the Father's activity on Earth takes place through angelic ministry.
- For every physical sense that we have, there's a corresponding spiritual sense.
- God is real and can be experienced.
- We need to be looking at what is going on in our life so we can give God credit and glory when we do experience Him.

## Questions

1. When the phrase God is "saving us from all of our troubles" is used here, what victorious certainty about King Jesus is this based upon?
2. If Jesus did not rise from the dead, what does Paul say we are in I Corinthians 15? What proofs seal the deal?
3. What happened to Paul to convince him of Yeshua's resurrection?
4. Do angels exist and minister according to Psalm 34?
5. What is both the blessing and danger of acknowledging angelic ministry? What did Jesus have to say about angels? How do we keep this in perspective?
6. In experiencing the Lord, or tasting and seeing the Lord is good, Rabbi said spiritual senses are involved? How do they compare to physical senses?
7. Tell about times when you were able to connect with God through sensory experiences.
