Main Points

- King David, King of Israel is transliterated in Hebrew David Melech, Melech Yisrael
- God's gentleness, His faithfulness to David, is what made David great.
- LORD in English is YHWH in Hebrew. Yud Hei Vav Hei (Yahweh)
- YHWH, Yud Hei Vav Hei, is God's personal covenant Name that He revealed to the children of Israel.
- David's continual praising of God was a choice, a matter of will, and you and I can control our will.
- In order to walk in victory, we need to transcend living by our feelings, and we need to become soldiers and live by our will.
- Start the day blessing Father through Yeshua.
- **The Law of First Fruits:** When you give God the first part of your day, it orders the rest of your day.
- Family in Hebrew is Mishpocha; Friends is Chaverim
- When you get strong, you will be happy.
- We should not let the fear of man stop us from continually having the praise of the LORD in our mouths.
- Humility has to do with dependency.

Questions

2. David addressed God by His personal name. What can we gather from this about his relationship with God?
3. What does the very first phrase of this psalm tell us David was doing with his will, whether he felt like it or not? What must we do if we are to pattern ourselves after David and be a good soldier?
4. When we struggle with negative emotions and feelings, what can we do to change it?
5. What is the Law of First Fruits and how can this affect our being and level of peace and joy?
6. How can you bring your testimony to the world as you live each day and change the culture of the world?
7. How can you begin to more publicly boast in the Lord? Begin to pray for opportunities to do this more and more.
