## The End and the Age To Come

### Scripture

- **Isaiah 60:3**  
“Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising.”
- **Luke 2:32**  
A light of Revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel.”
- **Zechariah 9:9**  
Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; He is just and endowed with salvation, Humble and mounted on a donkey, even on a colt, the foal of a donkey.
- **Matthew 21:1-5**  
When they had approached Jerusalem and had come to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, “Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied there and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to Me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, ‘The Lord has need of them,’ and immediately he will send them.” This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: “Say to the daughter of Zion, ‘Behold your King is coming to you, gentle, and mounted on a donkey, even on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.’”
- **Isaiah 53:1-6**  
Who has believed our message? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? For He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of parched ground; He has no stately form or majesty that we should look upon Him, nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him. He was despised and forsaken of men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and like one from whom men hide their face. He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. Surely our griefs He Himself bore, and our sorrows He carried; Yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, and by His scourging we are healed. All of us like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; But the Lord has caused the iniquity of us all to fall on Him.
- **John 1:11**  
He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him.
- **Psalms 22:14-16**  
I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; My heart is like wax; It is melted within me. My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue cleaves to my jaws; and you lay me in the dust of death. For dogs have surrounded me; a hand of evildoers has encompassed me; They pierced my hands and my feet.
- **John 20:25**  
“...Unless I see in His hands the imprint of the nails and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe.”

- **Psalm 16:9-11**  
Therefore, my heart is glad, and my glory rejoices; My flesh also will dwell securely. For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol; nor will You allow Your Holy One to undergo decay. You will make known to me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; In your right hand there are pleasures forever.
- **Acts 2:22-24, 32**  
Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know—this man, delivered over by the predetermined plan and knowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put Him to death. But God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power. This Jesus God raised up again, to which we are all witnesses.”
- **Zechariah 13:1; 12:10**  
“In that day a fountain will be opened for the house of David and for the inhabitants of Jerusalem, for sin and for impurity.  
“I will pour out on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the Spirit of grace and of supplication, so that they will look on Me whom they have pierced; and they will mourn for Him, as one mourns for an only son and they will weep bitterly over Him like the bitter weeping over a firstborn.”
- **Romans 11:25-27**  
For I do not want you, brethren, to be uninformed of this mystery—so that you will not be wise in your own estimation—that a partial hardening has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in; and so all Israel will be saved; just as it is written, “The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from Jacob. This is My covenant with them, when I take away their sins.”
- **Daniel 7:13-14**  
I kept looking in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven once like a Son of Man was coming, and He came up to the Ancient of Days and was presented before Him. And to Him was given dominion, glory, and a kingdom, that all the peoples, nations and men of every language might serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion which will not pass away; And His kingdom is one which will not be destroyed.
- **Mark 13:24-26**  
But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers that are in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory.

## **Main Points**

- Brit Chadasha-Hebrew transliteration for the New Testament
- Messianic Revelation
  - **The Messiah will be a light and minister to the Gentiles.**
  - **The Messiah would enter Jerusalem on a donkey.**
  - **The Messiah would be initially rejected by Israel.**
  - **The Messiah would be crucified.**
  - **The Messiah would rise from the dead.**
  - **Israel, who rejected the Messiah, will be brought to salvation.**
  - **The Messiah will return.**
- Yahweh M'Kaddesh
  - Transliterated from Hebrew and means The LORD who sanctifies.

2. What are some specific details that find exact prediction in the life of Yeshua in the New Testament accounts?
3. What point did Rabbi Schneider raise about the rejection of the Messiah? What passage is the most specific description of the actual life of Jesus?
4. Though rejection of Jesus by the Jewish people then, and even now, what specific promises for them will find fulfillment at the end of period of the Gentiles?
5. What Old Testament Scripture foreshadows the specific illustration of the suffering of Christ? What New Testament passage speaks of the wounds of Jesus?
6. Was the resurrection only a New Testament doctrine? Explain from the Old Testament.
7. Have you by faith, seen the wounds in Jesus' hands and placed your fingers in His side? Have you anchored your faith in the One prophesied hundreds of years ago?
