Scripture

- **Genesis 1:10, 12, 16-18, 21, 25, 27-30**

¹⁰God called the dry land earth, and the gathering of the waters He called seas; and God saw that it was good.

¹²The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing fruit with seed in them, after their kind; and God saw that it was good.

¹⁶God made the two great lights, the greater light to govern the day, and the lesser light to govern the night; He made the stars also. God placed them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, and to govern the day and the night, and to separate the light from the darkness; and God saw that it was good.

²¹God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarmed after their kind, and every winged bird after its kind; and God saw that it was good.

²⁵God made the beasts of the earth after their kind, and the cattle after their kind, and everything that creeps on the ground after its kind; and God saw that it was good.

²⁷God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. God blessed them; and God said to them, “Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth.”

²⁹Then God said, “Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the surface of all the earth, and every tree which has fruit yielding seed; it shall be food for you; and to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the sky and to everything that moves on the earth which has life, I have given every green plant for food”; and it was so.

Main Points

- The Catholic Church believes that “the rock” was the papacy and that Peter was the first pope.
- The Protestant Church believes that “the rock” was Peter’s confession of faith.
- Another interpretation is that “the rock” was the rock of revelation.
- In order to be set free, we need revelation.
- It is up to you to give God your heart.
- We are still in the process of becoming.
- Your imperfections are what qualify you for greatness.
- Your sin is the starting point from which you journey.
- The victory that you will receive is dependent on how much you overcome.
- Revelations to set you free:
 - Don’t beat yourself up.
- God loves you where you are at, but He is not going to leave you where you are at.
