Scripture

1The LORD spoke again to Moses, saying, “Speak to the sons of Israel and say to them, The LORD’S appointed times which you shall proclaim as holy convocations—My appointed times are these...
24” Speak to the sons of Israel, saying, ‘In the seventh month on the first day of the month you shall have a rest, a reminder by blowing of trumpets, a holy convocation. You shall not do any laborious work, but you shall present an offering by fire to the LORD.’”

Main Points

- The English word LORD in Hebrew is YHWH or Yud Hei Vav Hei (Yahweh)
- Rosh Hashanah/Yom Teruah/The Feast of Trumpets (Sept.25-27, 2022)
- Every one of these holy days finds its ultimate climax in King Jesus.
- The blowing of the shofar precedes the break in of His Kingdom, the glory of God.

- Signs of Jesus' Return
 - Moral absolutes and the Ten Commandments have been removed from our society.
 - Knowledge has covered the earth.

Discussion Questions

1. Leviticus 23:24 describes God's desire to appoint for His people a celebration with the blowing of trumpets. Why is this also relevant for the body of Christ now called the church? (Galatians 6:16)

2. If all the feasts find their fulfillment in Jesus, then what is the fulfillment of the Feast of Trumpets? (2 Thess. 4:16-17)

3. What does the blowing of the shofar precede? Where is this seen in the Old Testament? (Exodus) Where is the final fulfillment? (Revelation 3:11)

4. For us today, what is the most critical truth to know and in which to anchor our living? (Rev. 22:12)

5. What two signs of the nearness of the Lord's return did Rabbi present?
